

Question Types

Questions are broken down into 3 parts:

- Point Value—(10, 20, 30)
- Question Type—(See below)
- Locator—(From John Chapter 1; From the Section Titled, “The Word Became Flesh”)

- Two/Three/etc. Part Question
 - More than one question coming from the **same** verse; all answers are found within a SINGLE verse.
 - Example—The **law** was given through whom and **grace and truth** came through whom? (John 1:17—Moses, Jesus)

- Two/Three/etc. Part Reference Question
 - More than one question each of them coming from a **separate** verse.
 - Example—From John Chapter 1.
How do verses 6 & 7 describe John? (John 1:6 & 1:7)

- Quotation Question
 - Must be quoted WORD FOR WORD; usually asked to quote a specific verse.
 - Example—From John. Quote verse 14 from the opening chapter.

- Quotation Completion Question—last place to hit is after “**QUOTE**”
 - Must be quoted WORD FOR WORD; finish the verse.
 - The vs. will begin with a UNIQUE word—No other vs. will begin with that word.
 - Finish this verse, quote, “Through him all things were made...” (John 1:3)

- Essence Question
 - Does not have to be quoted perfectly—only “key” words.
 - Example— From John Chapter 1.
Give, in essence, the verse in which Moses is named. (John 1:17)

- Essence Completion Question— last place to hit is after “**QUOTE**”
 - Does not have to be quoted perfectly—only “key” words; finish the verse.
 - Example—Finish, in essence, this verse, quote, “No one has ever seen God...” (John 1:18)

- Scripture Text Question— last place to hit is after “**QUOTE**”
 - The question will be asked based on a portion of scripture quoted within the question.
 - Example—From John Chapter 1.
What, QUOTE, “shines in the darkness?” (John 1:5—the light)

- Statement and Question
 - A statement which gives clues to the question will be made **BEFORE** the question is asked.
 - Example—From the Section Titled, “John the Baptist Denies Being the Christ.” One Old Testament Scripture is found. Give this Old Testament Scripture. (John 1:23—underlined portion of the verse.)

- Two/Three/etc. Part Answer
 - When a question requires **more** answers than there are parts to a question.
 - Example—2 Part Answer. From John Chapter 1. Verse 29 names which individuals? (John 1:29—John, Jesus)

- Give a Complete Answer
 - Demands an answer that is **LONGER** than ONE word.
 - Comes from 1 Verse **ONLY** unless the question says, “From Consecutive/Separate Verses.”
 - Example—From the Section Titled, “Jesus Calls Philip and Nathanael.” Nathanael declared what? (John 1:49—“Rabbi, you are the Son of God; you are the King of Israel.”)
[this is a Give a Complete Answer because it is longer than ONE word]
